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



## SALIENT FEATURES OF LAW COURSES

1. A student, after his Pre-University education, may opt for legal education just as some other would opt for medical, engineering or other professional course at this stage by joining the five year law course.
2. Five-Year Law Course gives extensive training to the students not only in the law subjects, but also in the allied subjects such as English, Economics, Political Science, Sociology, History, Business Environment, Managerial Economics, Business Communications, Entrepreneurship Development, International Business, etc.
3. Also a student, after completing his graduation or post graduation in any discipline, may join Three-Year LL.B. Course.
4. Law courses are conducted only by whole-time day colleges and University Departments recognised by the Bar Council of India.
5. Our courses provide for extensive practical training in the subjects of procedural law as well as in Law Office Management, Computer Application in Legal Profession and similar other areas.
6. As the intake is limited, students joining these courses will get personal attention.
7. After the successful completion of Three-Year Law Course, the student will get LL.B. degree.  
After the successful completion of the Five-Year Law Course, the student will get B.A.,LL.B., B.B.A.,LL.B., & B.Com.,LL.B. A student securing LL.B., B.A., LL.B., B.B.A., LL.B., and B.Com.,LL.B. degree can-
  - a. join the highly respected profession of law as an advocate which brings name and money;
  - b. join judicial services and become a Judge;
  - c. become a legal adviser to Banks, Insurance Companies, Multi-National Companies, Societies, etc.
  - d. practice as a sales tax and income tax consultant;
  - e. practice as an industrial consultant;
  - f. get new opportunities emerging in K.P.O. and L.P.O. sectors;
  - g. join large law and consultancy firms;
  - h. join corporate world.
  - i. higher studies.

There are several other opportunities as well.

## COMMON TO BOTH THREE-YEAR LL.B., FIVE-YEAR B.A., LL.B., FIVE-YEAR B.B.A., LL.B., AND B.COM.,LL.B. COURSES

**MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION :** Medium of instruction is English. However, the students may write the answers in the examinations and tests either in English or Kannada.

**ATTENDANCE :** No student shall be permitted to appear for the Semester Examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 75% attendance in the course concerned.

**TESTS AND TUTORIALS :** As per the requirements of the University and the method of instructions adopted by this College, tests and tutorials in each subject and seminars and group discussion on important legal topics will be arranged. Attendance and participation in the same are compulsory for all students.

## THREE-YEAR LAW DEGREE COURSE (LL.B.)

**ADMISSION :** Application for admission to the Course should be made in the prescribed form with the necessary certificates and fees.

### ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

- a) An applicant who has graduated in any discipline of knowledge from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent national institution recognized as a Deemed to be University or Foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence, may apply for Three year degree course in law leading to the conferment of LL.B. degree on successful completion of the regular programme conducted under the KSLU Regulations.
- b) Be or be less than thirty years in case of general category of applicants and thirty five years in the case of applicants from SC, ST and other backward communities as on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2019.
- c) Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of General category applicants, 42% (41.5% & above shall be treated as 42%) for OBC category and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

### EXPLANATION

- i) An applicant who has passed the 3 years U.G. degree and 2/3 years P.G. degree from Open or Deemed University recognized by and established under the UGC Act, after prosecuting the studies in the pattern of 10+2 at Secondary/Higher Secondary Schooling is eligible for admission.
- ii) An applicant will be eligible, if he/she obtains 45% of marks in P.G. Degree, provided that he/she has prosecuted the study pattern in 10+2+3 format.
- iii) The applicant who has passed the qualifying examination (U.G. or P.G. degree) in a single sitting examination is not eligible for admission to 3 yr LL.B Law Course of KSLU, Hubballi.

THE ADMISSION WILL BE PROVISIONAL AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE KARNATAKA STATE LAW UNIVERSITY, HUBBALLI. THE COLLEGE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE IF A STUDENT WHO IS ADMITTED PROVISIONALLY IS SUBSEQUENTLY FOUND INELIGIBLE BY THE UNIVERSITY.

### PROMOTION

1. A student duly enrolled shall be eligible to pursue his/her studies in the Three-Year Law Degree Programme notwithstanding that he/she has not successfully completed any of the prescribed courses in any of the previous semester examinations conducted by the University from time to time. However, appearing for the examination is compulsory.
2. Award of marks in respect of practical shall be as prescribed by the University in its Notifications, Regulations, Ordinances or Statutes, and the like.
3. A student shall have to successfully complete the entire Three-Year Programme within a period of six years from the date of his/her registration in the said Programme.
4. A student shall be deemed to have successfully completed a paper only when he/she has secured not less than 40% of marks in that paper.

**AWARD OF DEGREE :** A student is eligible for the award of LL.B. Degree after he/she has successfully completed all the courses prescribed in all the semesters, provided his or her character and conduct are found to be satisfactory during the course.

**ADMISSION :** Application for admission to the Course should be made in the prescribed form with the necessary certificates and fees.

### **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION :**

To be eligible for admission in the 5 year B.A.,LL.B./ B.B.A.,LL.B. and B.COM.,LL.B. integrated course, the candidate should:

- a) have successfully completed Pre-University course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate course) from a recognised University of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognised by the Union or by the State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognised by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.

Provided that applicants who have obtained +2 Higher Secondary Pass Certificate or First Degree Certificate after prosecuting studies in distance or correspondence method shall also be considered as eligible for admission to the course.

Provided further that the applicants who have obtained 10+2 or graduation or post graduation through open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification for prosecuting such studies are not eligible for admission to the course.

- b) be or be less than twenty years in case of general category of applicants and less than twenty two years in the case of applicants from SC, ST and other backward communities as on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2019.
- c) have secured marks, which shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in qualifying examination, in case of general category applicants, , 42% (41.5% & above shall be treated as 42%) for OBC category and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

THE ADMISSION WILL BE PROVISIONAL AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE KARNATAKA STATE LAW UNIVERSITY, HUBBALLI. THE COLLEGE IS NOT RESPONSIBLE IF A STUDENT WHO IS ADMITTED PROVISIONALLY IS SUBSEQUENTLY FOUND INELIGIBLE BY THE UNIVERSITY.

## HOSTEL FACILITY

The College tries to arrange the accommodation for the residence of students. A student who desires to stay in the Hostel should apply for the same after seeking admission to the College.

The entire amount is to be paid after allotment of accommodation in Hostel. Hostel Fees and Electricity Charges once paid will not be refunded.

## PRACTICAL TRAINING

In order to produce better lawyers it is very much essential that we should train them with necessary skills and good etiquettes in addition to providing them sufficient knowledge to conduct the cases. While theory classes are sufficient to gain the necessary knowledge, the other two can be gained only by practice. In this direction, practical training is very important. It is also necessary to give the students experience of conducting the cases entirely, not just arguing them. They should know how to get information from the clients, preparing notes, drafting and filing of pleadings, production of documentary evidence, examination and cross-examination of witnesses, arguing the cases, etc. They should know all the stages of different types of cases. This also perfects their knowledge already gained through theory classes. With the above broad objectives in mind, we conduct practical training to the students. As the practical training is part of the syllabus, participation in the same is compulsory.

Third Semester students of 3-Year Course and Seventh Semester students of 5-Year Course are taught the skills of advocacy mainly through classroom lectures and seminars. Eminent members of Belagavi Bar and Bench deliver special lectures on professional ethics and professional skills.

Fourth Semester students of 3-Year Course and Eighth Semester students of 5-Year Course are trained in the Alternative Disputes Resolution Methods through class room lectures and simulation exercises.

Fifth Semester students of 3-Year Course and Ninth Semester students of 5-Year Course are taught drafting skills. Every student has to prepare 15 pleadings and 15 conveyancing exercises.

Final Semester students have to attend the office of advocates to observe the client counselling and preparation of cases. They have also to attend courts and observe the proceedings, and record the same in a journal. Every student has to present arguments in three Moot Court Sessions.

## MOOT COURT COMPETITIONS

Moot courts are nothing but simulated court exercises which teach and encourage students to present and argue a case as an advocate. Usually, the College sends students to participate in different moot court competitions conducted by various institutions. Now Moot Court has become part of the curriculum, final year students are required to study the same. We conduct the prestigious M. K. Nambyar Memorial National Level Moot Court Competition every year.



## INTERNSHIP

Internship is a compulsory component of both the Law Courses. Every student of 3-Year Course has to undergo internship of 90 days and every student of 5-Year Course has to undergo internship of 150 days spread over the entire course. However, internship during any academic year shall not exceed 30 days. Every student shall maintain an Internship Diary and submit at the end of the Course.

## COMPUTER EDUCATION ►

Today, a lot of information may be accessed through computers. Students are given basic computer education and skills of obtaining relevant information with the help of computer and internet.



## ◀ SOFT SKILL TRAINING

Effective presentation of a case before the court is a key to success. Students are trained in public speaking, presentation skill, conducting meetings and a course in etiquette, manners and other special skills.

## MULTI-GYM ►

A well equipped Multi-Gym is provided for the benefit of students, which can be availed on payment of a nominal fee. The multi-gym is maintained in a separate hall where many students can exercise at the same time.



## ◀ COLLEGE LIBRARY

A qualified Librarian is in charge of the library. Standard and up-to-date books of law and law journals are available for the benefit of the students. There is a well equipped Reading Room which can easily accommodate over 112 students at a time. For the benefit of only those students who belong to S.C. and S.T., we have two Post-Metric Text Book Banks sanctioned by the District Officer for the Backward Classes and Minorities, Belagavi. ## HOME LENDING LIBRARY RULES

1. On all working days books are issued from 8.00 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. However, the reading room is kept open from 8 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. (from one month prior to examination till the end of the examination, reading room is kept open from 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m.).
2. Those students who have obtained their identity cards and paid the library deposit and fees are entitled to hold one Borrower's Ticket and one Reference Card against each of them only one book can be borrowed at a time.
3. Borrower's Ticket is not transferable. In case of the loss of the original Borrower's Ticket, a duplicate Borrower's Ticket will be issued for which the Borrower is liable to pay Rs. 100 in the College Office and produce the receipt along with a copy of his/her photograph of identity size. Similarly, in case the original Identity Card is lost, the student shall have to pay Rs. 100 in the College Office and produce the receipt along with his/her application and a copy of his/her photograph, for issuing duplicate Identity Card. However, the students shall note that they are held responsible for any books, Journals etc. borrowed, if any, against their original Borrower's Ticket or Identity Card.
4. Loss of, or damage to, the books borrowed shall be made good by the borrower and if necessary, the library deposit of the borrower may be forfeited. If the book is lost by the borrower he/she has to replace the same by a new book of latest edition. If the lost book is out of print, the borrower has to pay two times of the cost of the book.
5. Paperback editions, reference books, periodicals and rare books will be available for reading only in the reading hall against the deposit of reference card. If such books or periodicals are taken out of the library without the knowledge of the library staff, penalty of Rs. 10 per day will be imposed.
6. Penalty of Re. 5 per day will be imposed for delay in returning the library books. If there is a delay of more than 50 days in returning the books, notice will be issued to the defaulter and the cost of the same will be borne by the defaulter.
7. For borrowing valuable books, the borrower may be required to pay extra deposit equal to the difference between the cost of book and the deposit already paid by the borrower.
8. All payments towards fees, recovery of the cost of books, fines, deposits, library dues should be made only in the College Office. NO CASH TRANSACTIONS ARE MADE IN THE LIBRARY except as may be notified. Reference Card or Borrower's Ticket of the defaulter will be returned only after the cash receipt issued by the College Office towards the payment of dues is produced.
9. Library Rules in detail are permanently displayed on the Notice Board of the Library for the information and guidance of the students.
10. Any damage to the property including computers, etc. will have to be made good by the concerned student.

## REFUND OF DEPOSITS

1. All deposits are forfeited on cancellation of admission.
2. The caution money will be forfeited if the applicant, after getting admission, does not join the College.
3. The caution money is also liable to be appropriated towards dues, if any.
4. A student who wishes to withdraw his/her deposit should apply in the prescribed form & within the Stipulated Time.
5. No claim for the refund of any deposit will be entertained after six months from the date of leaving the College.
6. A student who wishes to cancel his/her admission for the Second Term, should inform the Principal in writing at the end of the First Term, failing which he/she will have to pay the Second Term fees. No Transference Certificate will be issued to such student unless he/she pays the full amount that accrues due.

# COLLEGE RULES

## GENERAL RULES

1. All students are required to be punctual and regular in their attendance. Students remaining absent without permission will do so at their own risk.
2. Every student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance in lectures, tests, tutorials, practicals, etc. in every subject. Student falling short of the prescribed minimum attendance in any subject(s) may not be permitted to take examination in accordance with the Rules framed by the University and the College.
3. Fees once paid to the College are not liable to be refunded or adjusted under any circumstances.
4. The College will not be responsible for the loss of any letter or correspondence sent to the students at the College address.
5. Letters to the Principal should be accompanied by reply postage whenever reply is desired.
6. Students should see the College Notice Board regularly for announcements regarding classes, special classes, tutorials, tests, award of scholarships, etc.

## RULES RELATING TO CO-CURRICULAR & EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. There shall be a separate Department for each co-curricular and extra-curricular activity. Co-curricular activities shall be supplementary to the regular course of studies and may consist in organising lectures, discourses, symposia, or such other cultural activities as may be decided by the Principal.
2. Principal shall be the Ex-officio President of the Departments and may appoint a Chairman for each Department.
3. One Class Representative is nominated by the Principal for each class of 3-Year and 5-Year Law Courses, who shall be the successful student securing the highest number of marks in the previous year examination.
4. There shall be a Union consisting of nominated students. Councillors are nominated on the basis of merit and subject to the other conditions as may be prescribed by the Principal from time to time.
5. The activities of the Departments shall be so conducted that they will not affect the regular course of studies.
6. There will be no observance of Students' Week, Gathering or Music Day Function. However, certain selected entertainment programmes or cultural activities may be presented before the guests with the prior permission of the Principal.
7. A Councillor who is nominated to the Students Union shall cease to hold the post if:
  - (a) He fails to attend any three consecutive meetings of the Department or Union without proper justification.
  - (b) He discontinues the Course.
  - (c) He is found to be indifferent in discharging his duties or is disobedient to the Chairman.
  - (d) He is removed from the post by the President on the recommendation of the Chairman.
  - (e) He, for any reason, ceases to hold the post shall be disqualified from holding the post during the rest of the year.
8.
  - (a) No games shall be played by the students by missing the classes.
  - (b) Students desirous of practising any of the athletic or track events may do so on the College Play Ground without causing any inconvenience to the other institutions in the Campus.
9. Under no circumstances the Chairman is responsible for conducting any of the events if the budget earmarked exceeds for such item or for such Department as the case may be.
10. In case of any dispute that may arise in this regard, the decision of the Chairman, subject to the revision by the President, shall be final and binding.
11. The power to alter, amend, add to or delete from these rules shall vest with the Principal and his opinion as to the interpretation of any of these rules shall be final.

## RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. Students are required to maintain the highest standard of behaviour and discipline at all times both inside and outside the College.
  2. Students shall observe the Disciplinary Rules framed by the College from time to time. Violation of the Rules will be dealt with by the Principal in the manner he/she considers fit and his/her decision in the matter will be final and binding
  3. On the ringing of the bell, students shall assemble in the Class Rooms and wait for the Lecturer. Students shall maintain absolute silence in the Class Room. Once the lecture commences, no student shall enter or leave the Class Room without the permission of the Lecturer.
  4. Loitering around the College when classes are going on is forbidden.
  5. Making noise and disturbing classes or the reading room, and indulging in any kind of violence with the staff and fellow students are treated as acts of gross indiscipline. Those who are found guilty of such misconduct will be dealt with severely and may be liable for expulsion from the College or subjected to heavy fine. Students whose presence in the College is found injurious and harmful to the maintenance of order and discipline of the College are liable to be rusticated.
  6. Irregular attendance, indifference in regard to class work, tests, tutorials and examination, discourtesy towards the teachers, insubordination, obscenity in word and act, and any activities bringing or likely to bring disrepute to the College or staff are strictly forbidden, and the students are liable for disciplinary action which may include expulsion from the College.
  7. Attendance to the College functions, Association Meetings of the College Assembly, Legal Aid Clinics, Legal Literacy Camps, Court Visits, Moot Courts, Viva Voce, etc. is obligatory to all students.
  8. The College property shall be handled with care and nothing shall be done by a student which act may cause or may be likely to cause damage to the same. If any damage is caused to any property belonging to the College, the loss will be recovered from the student(s) known to be immediately responsible for the damage, and if the student(s) responsible for the damage are not ascertained, the loss may be collected equally from all the students of the Class or College.
  9. Writing or drawing pictures on black-boards or walls or on benches, tables etc., affixing posters, littering etc. are strictly prohibited, violations attracting the fines.
  10. Students shall not organise any activities or associate with any group not concerned with the College, without the permission of the Principal. Participation in any political or para-political activities is strictly forbidden.
  11. No meeting shall be convened, no person shall be invited to address the students, no publication shall be issued and no canvassing or mobilizing of the students for any particular opinion or action without the permission of the Principal.
  12. Participation in agitations, demonstrations or strikes or protest of any kind is strictly prohibited. Boycotting classes, shouting slogans, obstructing fellow students from entering into classes will be viewed seriously and the students indulging in such activities are liable to be expelled from the College.
  13. No student shall organise any tour, picnic, etc. without the express permission of the Principal.
  14. Books, magazines, newspapers, etc. which are not approved by the Principal are not allowed to be brought to the College.
  15. Every student should possess the Identity Card issued by the College which should be produced whenever asked for, especially when dealing with the Office and Library, and when asked by the Security Personnel.
- 16. RAGGING, CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOL, SMOKING, CHEWING OF TOBACCO, GUTKHA, SPITTING, TEASING AND DRUG ABUSE, ETC. ARE STRICTLY FORBIDDEN IN THE COLLEGE AND HOSTEL PREMISES. STUDENTS ARE LIABLE FOR HEAVY PENALTY WHICH MAY BE FOLLOWED BY THE EXPULSION OF THE STUDENT FROM THE COLLEGE AND HOSTEL FOR VIOLATION OF THIS RULE. USING THE MOBILE PHONES IN THE CLASS ROOMS AND LIBRARY IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN, AND THE VIOLATION OF THE SAME WILL ATTRACT THE FINE OF RS. 200. THE COLLEGE LIBRARY HAS BEEN DECLARED AS SILENT- ZONE. HENCE, IF ANY ONE SPEAKS THEREIN WILL BE FINED RS. 25. STUDENTS MUST KEEP THE CLASS ROOMS AND THE COLLEGE PREMISES CLEAN, AND MUST THROW THE WASTE ONLY IN THE DUST BINS PROVIDED, AND ANY VIOLATION ATTRACTS THE FINE OF RS. 25.**
17. Students will have to wear the prescribed uniform which is black coat with light blue shirt and black trouser uniformly printed tie for boys and black coat with light blue kurta, kameez with black salwar or light blue shirt and black trousers for girls on every day except thursday and on all the days of college functions as notified. Uniform on other days shall be the same except for coat and tie.
  18. Students are expected to treat the College as their own and to co-operate in its smooth and efficient running.
  19. Violation of any order, rule or notification issued by the Principal from time to time will be deemed to be misconduct attracting severe punishment.
  20. Use of mobile phone in college will attract fine.
  21. Student shall not bring their vehicles in college campus.

## PUNISHMENT FOR INDISCIPLINE

1. Any student who is found to have committed any act of indiscipline is liable to any one or more of the following punishments:
  - a) Warning;
  - b) Fine;
  - c) Recovery in part or full of loss or damages to the College property or property of others caused by the delinquent student;
  - d) Expulsion from the College;
  - e) Withholding of certificates.
2. The punishments are liable to be inflicted summarily at the discretion of the Principal whose decision will be final and binding.

## PROHIBITION OF RAGGING IN COLLEGE AND HOSTEL

1. Ragging is defined and made punishable under the Karnataka Education Act, 1983.

### KARNATAKA EDUCATION ACT, 1983

Section 2: Definitions: (29) 'Ragging' means causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of a practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his person or exposes him to ridicule or to forbear from doing any lawful act, by intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring him or by using criminal force to him or by holding out to him any threat of such intimidation, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force.

### Section 116: Penalty for Raging:

1. No person who is a student in an educational institution including an institution under the direct management of the University or of the Central Government shall commit ragging.
  2. Any person who contravenes sub-section (1) shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to one year or with fine which may extend to two thousand rupees or with both.
2. In addition to considering it as punishable offence under the said section 116, the said offence shall also be punishable under sections 109, 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 302, 305, 339, 340, 341, 342, 343, 346, 347, 354, 359, 368, 448, 451 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code entailing inflictment of extreme punishment in terms of Standing Order No. 940 of Director General and Inspector General of Police.
  3. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately, including expulsion from institution.
  4. A Review Committee and Flying Squad have been constituted to prevent ragging in the College and Hostel.

Parents and Guardians should please note that students admitted to this college are expected to maintain a very high standard of diligence and good conduct and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the College as may be notified from time to time.

Parents and Guardians are expected to call upon the college from time to time and ascertain regularity of their children. Sometimes the college may call (telephonically) the parents and inform the repeated absenteeism of their children, in which case a service charge will be levied.
